Re: Nunavut Wildlife Management Board decision pertaining to the Auyuittuq National Park Management Plan

Dear Mr. Prentice,

At the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB or Board) Regular Meeting No. 63, the Board was provided an overview of the Auyuittuq National Park Management Plan and was requested to make a decision on the management plan.

Upon full consideration of the management plan, the Board has made the following decision:

"Moved that the NWMB, pursuant to subsection 5.2.34 (c) of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement, approve the Auyuittuq National Park Management Plan as submitted to the NWMB on March 2010."

The NWMB's approval is based on the consideration that the management plan does not introduce any non-quota limitations nor does it establish any other limitations on Inuit harvesting (i.e. on commercial fishing), in the Auyuittuq National Park. Any such proposed restrictions would have to be approved by the NWMB as per the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement (NLCA)*.

The NWMB looks forward to working in cooperation with Parks Canada and the Joint Park Management Committee in ensuring that the strategies and objectives identified in the management plan are achieved.
