Re: NWMB decision on an additional walrus sport hunt application for 2011

Dear Minister Shea,

On February 14th, 2011 the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board) forwarded you the Board's decision letter approving walrus sport hunt plans for four applicants for the 2011 harvesting season. On March 1st, 2011 the NWMB considered an additional walrus sport hunt application for the 2011 harvesting season that was unfortunately overlooked during the Board's initial review process. In accordance with sub-sections 5.2.34(d)(i) and 5.6.48 of the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement* (NLCA), the Board approved the sport hunt plan for Luke Eetuk of Coral Harbour, subject to specific conditions set out below.

The Board approved the hunt plan submitted by Luke Eetuk of Coral Harbour, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the applicant obtain written support from the Coral Harbour HTO for the six requested sport hunts;
- 2. That all struck, lost and landed information is reported to the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) Iqaluit;
- 3. That the hunt be conducted in compliance with all safety and regulatory requirements established by Transport Canada or DFO;
- 4. That the assignment of each walrus to a sport hunter be made in writing;
- 5. That there be no more than two strikes per walrus landed;
- 6. That samples be collected and provided to DFO for inspection of any animal that is in suspicion of contamination or disease.

Should you accept this decision, the NWMB anticipates that implementation of the decision by your department will include appropriate notification of the walrus sport hunt allocation approval to the applicant. Should you have any questions or concerns with respect to any of these decisions, please do not hesitate to contact the NWMB.

Thank you for your letters dated February 14, 2011 and March 8, 2011, conveying the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decision regarding the Walrus Sport Hunts for 2011.

This letter confirms that I accept the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decision to approve 25 sport hunts for the Igloolik Hunters and Trappers Organization, 15 sport hunts for the Hall Beach Hunters and Trappers Organization, six sport hunts each for Aaron Emiktowt and Luke Eetuk of Coral Harbour and three sport hunts for Joe Amarualik of Resolute Bay subject to the corresponding conditions set out in the Board's February 14th and March 8th letters for the 2011 season.

Departmental officials in Iqaluit will notify the successful applicants. Once the area office in Iqaluit has received all of the required information to complete the licence, departmental officials will be able to issue the licence for the sport hunt.

I look forward to continued collaboration with the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board and its technical staff on walrus co-management issues.
