#### **Project Overview:**

Polar bears across Nunavut play an important factor in Nunavummiut lives: they provide food, income through arts/crafts and sport hunts in various communities. Management and decision-making bodies require up-dated information to make management and harvest decisions which will ensure wildlife resources are vital and can provide for the demand of the local populous. Through ongoing research, the Government of Nunavut Department of Environment is able to inform affected Hunter and Trapper Organizations, and other co-management partners (locally/nationally/internationally) about the status of polar bear subpopulations and derive a management objective.

The Lancaster Sound (LS) polar bear subpopulation is one of Nunavut's largest polar bear subpopulations – it spans a geographical area of about 470 000 km² (with about approximately 250 000 km² of sea-ice) and is home to an estimated 2541± 391(mean ± 1 SE) polar bears. Given the lack of recent data for LS, and the population estimate derived from data collected in the late 1990's has a high degree of uncertainty, in part due to environmental changes and a prolonged male-biased harvest that has been part of the polar bear management system. To fulfill mandated wildlife monitoring objectives and provide management advice to the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board, the Government of Nunavut proposed to undertake a 3-year study (2021-2023) involving genetic biopsy mark-recapture techniques to reassess the size and status of the LS polar bear subpopulation.

Unfortunately, in April 2021, during the first year of the project, a tragic helicopter accident claimed the lives of the project lead (Markus Dyck) as well as the helicopter pilot and engineer. In response to the tragedy, the project was cancelled, and the work postponed to the following fiscal year. The Department of Environment is proposing to conduct a hybrid approach in Lancaster Sound March 2023, by running an aerial abundance survey while involving a genetic biopsy mark-recapture component. This will allow for the derivation of a population estimate, as well as the collection of important demographic and genetic information to support future analyses and provide vital information for the management of the subpopulation.


