Message from the Chairperson

April 1st 2006 to March 31st 2007 was another very busy and exciting year for the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board). One Board Member's term expired in February, a second seat remained vacant during the year. The Board welcomed the newest addition to the NWMB staff; Paul Frame, who accepted a new one-year term position as the Wildlife Administrative Biologist.

Some new approaches, operationally, were introduced to the Board during the fiscal year. Public hearings were initiated to maximize the transparency of the Board and to maximize input by the affected harvesters.

The first public hearing was held in Iqaluit in September 2006 to review the Total Allowable Harvest (TAH) levels and Non-Quota Limitations (NQLs) under the Wildlife Regulations and Orders made pursuant to the Wildlife Act. The Wildlife Act was implemented by the Territorial Cabinet on July 9, 2005. The second phase of this public hearing was held in October 2006. It was expected that a further public hearing would be necessary in the following fiscal year, in order to complete all the TAHs and NQLs under the Wildlife Regulations and Orders.

Decisions by the Board that require support by a Minister are now being made in-camera in order to give the respective Minister the opportunity to make his/her decision with no influence from the public or media. Previously the Board was making decisions in their regular sessions and this made the Board's decision public, before the appropriate Minister had an opportunity to review and respond to the Board.

Internal policy review work was begun, involving the Board's Governance Manual, Human Resources Manual, Financial/Administrative Manual, and the Wildlife Management Policy. It is expected that the internal policy development/revision work will be completed by the end of the next fiscal year.

The Board also began work on development of an Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit Policy for the NWMB.

A variety of tasks, meetings and activities were carried out by the Board during the past fiscal year and the following are some of the highlights:

The Chairperson attended all the Regional Wildlife Organizations' (RWOs) Annual General Meetings (AGMs) held in each of the three Regions, Kitikmeot, Kivalliq and Qikiqtaaluk. The Board participated in these AGMs to keep itself informed about regional/local issues and to update each RWO on the activities and responsibilities of the NWMB.

The Chief Operating Officer participated in a meeting involving all the Institutions of Public Government (IPGs), at Cambridge Bay. This was the first meeting held, involving all the IPGs since 1997.

The Chairperson participated in the Minister of Environment Canada's Species at Risk Act Round Table, held in Ottawa (Gatineau), in the fall of 2006. Approximately 120 people attended the meeting, due to the short time available, many participants did not get a chance to express their views.

The Chairperson and the Legal Counsel attended the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement implementation review meeting. Discussion centered around the Department of Indian Affairs & Northern Development's role of coordinating Land Claims implementation for Canada.

Some of the NWMB Board Members attended a three-day Governance Training event, organized and delivered by the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development in Iqaluit. Members of the Nunavut Water Board also attended the same training session.

A Marine (Offshore) Fisheries Allocation Policy development/consultation session involving all affected Hunters and Trappers Organizations in the Baffin Region along with the fishing industry, was conducted in Iqaluit during November 2006. It was decided that changes were required to the policy and a further consultation session would be required in the future.

The NWMB continued to successfully monitor the innovative Narwhal and Beluga Community-Based Management (CBM) systems operating in several communities

in Nunavut. Several requests to carry-over unused narwhal tags were discussed and approved.

The Board participated in the annual meeting of the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Quebec and Nunavut Regions with their respective co-management bodies, in Iqaluit. The meeting focused mainly on the management of Eastern Hudson Bay Beluga, other adjoining Beluga sub-populations and Bowhead Whales.

The Board is still working on seeking alternative ways to manage polar bears from the current management system in Nunavut. A Request for Proposal (RFP) was drafted by the NWMB to have the current system reviewed by an independent source. The Board is waiting for a response from its co-management partners in order to proceed to the next step in the process.

Walrus hunts were approved for Igloodik and Coral Harbour for the 2007 summer and fall hunts. Standard Non-quota Limitations (NQLs) were also approved for these sport hunts by the Board. A total of eleven successful walrus sport hunts were conducted in Nunavut communities during the summer and fall of 2006.

The Board reviewed thirty-five new applications and three (3) multi-year wildlife research projects, under the Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust, submitted by the Government of Nunavut's Department of Environment, the Department of Fisheries & Oceans Canada, and the Canadian Wildlife Service and Parks Canada. A total of twenty-six new applications and three multi-year projects were approved for 2007/08 fiscal year, totaling \$1,192,600.00. This is the highest amount ever awarded for wildlife research projects in a single year since the creation of the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board in 1994.

The Nunavut Wildlife Studies Fund provided a total of \$110,650.00 to non-governmental organizations for wildlife research, involving four applications out of five for the fiscal year 2007/08. The amount approved for the fiscal year was about the average awarded in the past 13 years.

The NWMB attended a “Struck and Lost” workshop, organized by the North Atlantic Marine Mammal Commission (NAMMCO), held at Copenhagen, Denmark. The reporting of struck and lost is weak in Nunavut and much was learned from the workshop that will be useful in Nunavut.

A bilateral meeting on marine fisheries resources between Nunavut and Greenland was held with the participation of the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board, at Copenhagen, Denmark.

Two meetings were held, in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories (NWT) by the NWT Wildlife Co-Management Boards’ Chairpersons’ meeting on Bluenose Caribou population decline concerns, with the NWMB participating. The forum will be making recommendations to the Territorial Governments of Nunavut and the NWT, on wildlife management measures to deal with the decline of the herd.

The Board staff spent considerable time and effort in developing a new Public Hearing site on the NWMB website. This site allows the public to review the Rules and Procedures for each of the Board’s hearings, the dates and locations of these meetings and the documents involved in the hearings in both Inuktitut and English.

Many important tasks were carried out successfully and decisions made by the Board during the fiscal year as per the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. However, many more tasks might have been accomplished if the Board had more staff to carry out tasks. The improved transparency of the Board has made it easier for the co-management partners and the general public to keep up with what the Board is doing for the Nunavummiut.

The NWMB co-ordinates its functions and activities with the Regional Wildlife Organizations and the Hunters and Trappers Organizations to ensure communication and co-operation with the many communities of the NSA.

The NWMB seeks to identify, develop and bring to bear the best information and expertise in the formulation of its decisions. The Board recognizes the role and power of various sources of information and expertise, including but not limited to, resource users, community elders, traditional knowledge and modern science.

The NWMB operates in an open forum, informing the public and providing for public input and participation.

NWMB Implementation Activities

During the 12 months from April 1st 2006 to March 31st 2007, the NWMB continued to perform its core functions in a thorough and timely fashion, and to ensure the continued maintenance of a model wildlife management system that has the confidence of the public, Inuit and Government. Set out in this section is a description of the twenty-five NWMB implementation activities undertaken during the 2006-2007 period. Under each general activity is a brief listing of specific results and achievements.

(a) Complete the final phase of the development of an efficient and economical system for the long-term storage of and access to the Nunavut Wildlife Harvest Study Database;

- The Board contracted a consultant to develop an electronic searchable data-base, and to create hard copy CD Rom Backups for distribution to the Government of Canada, Government of Nunavut and relevant Inuit agencies.

(b) Following the revised proposal for a second harvest study for this planning period, design the survey and commence data collection for the second planning period;

- The NWMB contracted a consultant to thoroughly review all aspects of the previous Nunavut Wildlife Harvest Study, and to prepare options for the organization and structure of the NWMB's next harvest study

(c) Continue the introduction of the Total Allowable Harvest-Basic Needs Level-Surplus (TAH-BNL-Surplus) management regime for particular stocks or populations of species in the NSA;

- The Board held a productive meeting with its co-management partners to continue discussions on the most effective and acceptable way(s) to continue the introduction of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management regime in Nunavut.
- The Board decided to adopt a policy to unilaterally initiate a public consideration of the establishment of a TAH or non-quota limitation (NQL), or the modification/removal of an existing TAH/NQL, where the most current Inuit Qaujimagatuqangit and/or scientific information indicates a TAH/NQL may be required or may need to be modified/removed. This policy will be applied even where no proponent comes forward to request such a public consideration.

(d) Pursuant to the principles of conservation, and in conformity with the development and initial introduction of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management regime, make appropriate decisions with respect to maintaining, establishing, modifying or removing TAHs and other restrictions on wildlife harvesting in the NSA;

- The Board wrote to the GN Minister of Environment requesting up-to-date stock status reports for the Western Hudson Bay (WH) and Baffin Bay polar bear populations, with the intention of publicly examining – as soon as reasonably possible – the conservation status of each of those populations.
- The Board agreed to fund a joint survey of the WH polar bear population, designed to assist in assessing the sustainable level of harvesting for that population. (However, due to weather problems, this survey had to be postponed until the following fiscal year.)

- The Board affirmed that TAH decisions for polar bear populations in the NSA are cumulative annual TAHs between July 1 and June 30 (including any accumulated credits from previous years) as set out in the “Flexible Quota System” of the 2004 Polar Bear Management MOUs.
 - The Board made several decisions regarding polar bear defense kills and the conversion of male and female polar bear credits into harvest tags.
 - The Board agreed to commence the process of considering potential harvesting restrictions on Inuit within the Thelon Game Sanctuary.
 - The Board approved a request from the Pond Inlet HTO – made pursuant to the CBM program – to carry forward into 2006 fifty percent of the community’s narwhal tags not used in 2005.
 - The Board approved the Gjoa Haven HTO request to carry over 7 narwhal tags from the 2006 harvest season to 2007.
 - The Board approved a harvest increase to 75 narwhal for the Gulf of Boothia narwhal stock.
 - The Board declined a request for an increase in the Hall Beach area narwhal quota.
 - The Board reviewed TAH increase requests for Narwhal from several non-CBM communities.
 - The Board approved a TAH of one bowhead whale for the 2007 or 2008 harvest seasons from the Foxe Basin/ Northern Hudson Bay stock.
 - The Board approved a request from Makivik (Nunavik) to harvest 25 Beluga from the Sanikiluaq area with approval and involvement of the Sanikiluaq HTA.
 - The Board approved harvest levels for exploratory arctic char fisheries in eleven water bodies in the Cumberland Sound area in 2006.
 - The Board approved a maximum harvest level of 3,000kg for an exploratory arctic char fishery in Koluktoo Bay Milne Inlet in 2006.
 - The Board approved a pre-emptive by-catch of 400mt for pink shrimp (*pandalus borealis*) inside the NSA.
 - The Board approved a plan to conduct a test fishery for crab in the NAFO Sub-Area 0 waters of the NSA.
 - The Board commenced the (initially-confidential) NLCA decision-making process for several dozen harvesting limitations (non-quota limitations and TAHs) proposed in the GN’s draft Wildlife Regulations and Orders.
 - The Board decided to send an NWMB representative to attend the NAMMCO Marine Mammal Struck and Lost Workshop in Denmark, scheduled for November 2007.
 - The Board approved the continuation in 2006 of the Northern Shrimp Research Foundation stock assessment survey in waters adjacent to Nunavut.
 - The Board recommended to DFO a pre-emptive by-catch of 400mt for pink shrimp (*pandalus borealis*) outside the NSA in Shrimp Fishing Area 3.
- (g)** Equitably allocate Nunavut’s share of commercial shrimp, turbot, and other marine resources among eligible fishers;
- The Board recommended individual allocations for an additional 2500mt of turbot in Division OA made available by the Minister, starting in 2006.
 - The Board recommended a 100 mt turbot allocation for inshore development.
 - The Board held a public consultation, attended by the Nunavut fishing industry, relevant HTOs, DFO, the GN and NTI, concerning its draft Allocation Policy for Commercial Marine Fisheries, and related documents.
 - The Board directed that the groundfish licence for NAFO Sub-Area 0 be assigned to the Baffin Fisheries Coalition for the 2007 fishing season.
- (h)** Continue to implement/monitor the three-year renewal (2005-2007) of the CBM system for beluga whales;
- The Board reviewed the draft Cumberland Sound Beluga Recovery Strategy.
 - NWMB staff continued to implement and monitor the CBM system for Beluga.
- (i)** Continue to implement/monitor the five-year renewal (2003-2007) of the community-based management (CBM) system for narwhals;
- (e)** In collaboration with the Government of Nunavut and NTI, continue the independent review of Nunavut’s Polar Bear management system;
- Members of the Polar Bear Management Independent Review Committee commenced the process of selecting a qualified and independent consultant to assist the Committee in the review of polar bear management in Nunavut.
- (f)** Provide advice to DFO concerning commercial shrimp, turbot, shellfish and other marine species allocations in Zones I and II;
- The Board recommended to DFO the continuation of existing individual commercial turbot and shrimp allocations for 2006, pending the introduction of a new NWMB Allocation Policy for Commercial Marine Fisheries, expected in 2007.
 - The Board approved a plan to conduct an exploratory snow crab and northern stone crab fishery in Division OA in the 2006 fishing season.

- The Board approved a request from the Pond Inlet HTO – made pursuant to the CBM program – to carry forward into 2006 fifty percent of narwhal tags not used in 2005.
- Staff continued to monitor the CBM system for narwhal.
- The Board approved a harvest increase to 75 narwhal for the Gulf of Boothia narwhal stock.

(j) Subject to the ongoing development and implementation of the TAH-BNL-Surplus management regime, establish a TAH-BNL for walrus populations to ensure there are resources for professional, sustainable walrus sport hunting ventures;

- While the Board carefully considered establishing TAHs-BNLs for Nunavut walrus populations, it concluded that there is still insufficient information available to allow the NWMB to proceed with such establishment in 2006-2007.
- To help gather the necessary information, the NWMB approved funding for research on walrus stocks in the NSA.
- In the interim, the Board approved walrus sport hunts and hunt plans in various communities in Nunavut and Nunavik for the 2007/08 hunting season.

(k) Continue to develop appropriate policies and strategies to document Inuit Qaujimagatuqangit (IQ) and to identify priority IQ needs, and continue to promote the inclusion of both IQ and modern science in all aspects of wildlife management;

- The Board held two working group meetings with its Nunavut co-management partners to develop an IQ workshop.
- In collaboration with the DFO Minister, the NWMB – relying upon and promoting relevant IQ principles – approved a cooperative, and ultimately successful, stewardship initiative to free a number of beluga whales trapped in a fjord near the community of Pangnirtung.

(l) Make appropriate decisions with respect to the approval of plans for the management and protection of particular wildlife or wildlife habitats;

- The Board approved management plans to conduct exploratory arctic char fisheries in eleven water bodies in the Cumberland Sound area in 2006.
- The Board approved a management plan to conduct an exploratory arctic char fishery in Koluktoo Bay Milne Inlet in 2006.
- The Board evaluated the Beverly Qamanirjuaq Caribou Management Plan.
- The Board received a briefing from the Bowhead Recovery Team on a proposed Bowhead Recovery Strategy.
- Board staff continued to work with Government of Nunavut staff in the development of draft Management Plans for Peary Caribou.
- Board staff provided guidance and advice to the Inter-jurisdictional Co-management Wildlife Boards on draft Bluenose caribou herd Management Plans.
- The Board approved the SARA Wolffish Recovery Strategy and Management Plan.
- The Board approved the SARA Eskimo Curlew Recovery Strategy.
- The Board approved the SARA Ross's Gull Recovery Strategy.

(m) Continue to provide guidance and advice on wildlife management and research priorities;

- Board staff reviewed progress reports for all research projects previously funded by the NWMB and considered research priorities in reviewing new-year applications for funding.
- Subject to conditions, the Board approved the Northern Shrimp Research Foundation (NSRF) request to conduct a shrimp test fishery inside the NSA in NAFO Division 0B, and recommended support for the offshore portion of the research in 0B.

(n) Continue to evaluate Government and non-government Research Funding Proposals, and to provide funding to researchers from the *Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust* and the *NWMB Studies Fund*;

- At the Board's Meeting No. 46 in June 2006, the Board approved funding in the amount of \$42,000 for DFO's Ringed Seal in Western Hudson Bay research project.
- At the Board's March 2007 meeting, the Board reviewed and approved Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust projects for a total of \$1,197,600.00 for the 2007-2008 fiscal year.
- At the same March 2007 meeting, the Board also approved NWMB Studies Fund Research proposals, for a total of \$140,389.00 for the 2007-2008 fiscal year.

(o) Continue to monitor relevant wildlife research conducted by government and others, through review of wildlife research permits and reports;

- The Board supported and encouraged scientific and IQ activities for the 2007/08 International Polar Year.
- The Board heard a DFO presentation on the status of char research in the (south) Qikiqtaaluk and Kivalliq Regions.
- Staff monitored wildlife research permits issued by government departments.
- Staff also reviewed progress reports for all research projects funded by the NWMB.

(p) Continue to ensure that wildlife research data and results from projects funded by the NWMB are made available to the public and encourage others to do likewise;

- All wildlife research project reports continued to be added in a timely manner to the Nunavut Wildlife Resource Centre libraries, and made available for public use.

(q) Continue to attend consultations between Canada and Greenland on shared wildlife stocks, and continue to work with administrative agencies and aboriginal peoples from other land claims areas concerning shared wildlife stocks;

- The NWMB Chairperson (a Commissioner) participated in the Canada/Greenland Joint Commission on Narwhal and Beluga.
- The NWMB staff attended the Bathurst Caribou Management meetings in Yellowknife.
- The NWMB staff met with the Bluenose Caribou Management Advisory Committee in both Yellowknife and Inuvik.

(r) Play an appropriate role in the negotiation of inter-jurisdictional wildlife management agreements;

- The NWMB provided detailed comments to the GN on its draft inter-jurisdictional Polar Bear management agreements.

(s) Continue to provide funding to the RWOs and HTOs;

- The NWMB provided quarterly RWO and HTO payments during the fiscal year. Those payments were delivered to the Nunavut Inuit Wildlife Secretariat (NIWS) for use by the RWOs and HTOs. The NIWS provides administrative and financial management support to RWOs and HTOs.
- The Board approved a contribution of \$60,000 to the NIWS, to assist with its financial/administrative assistance to RWOs and HTOs.

(t) Continue to communicate and work in cooperation with HTOs, RWOs, NTI and Government Departments, and with other institutions of public government - including other members of the Nunavut Marine Council - concerning land and resource management issues affecting Nunavut;

- The NWMB participated in three regional RWO AGMs.
- The NWMB's Chief Operating Officer was in regular contact with his counterparts in the other Institutions of Public Government
- The NWMB participated in an IPG round-table meeting.

(u) Continue to work closely with Government and Inuit in ensuring that new and amended legislation affecting Nunavut recognizes and respects land claims agreements and the jurisdictions of land claims bodies (e.g. progress in development of the *Nunavut Fisheries Regulations*, as well as Regulations and Orders required pursuant to the territorial *Wildlife Act* and the federal *Species at Risk Act*);

- The NWMB conducted hearings into the proposed TAHs and NQLs under the new Nunavut Wildlife Regulations and Orders.
- The NWMB participated in three meetings of the Nunavut Regulatory Review Committee – composed of representatives from DFO, the NWMB, NTI, Makivik (Nunavik Inuit) and the GN – dedicated to the development of draft Nunavut Fisheries Regulations.
- The NWMB participated in an informal working group - composed of representatives from the NWMB, DFO, Environment Canada, Parks Canada, the GN, NTI and Makivik – devoted to drafting a protocol to harmonize the listing processes under the NLCA and SARA.

(v) Where required by new legislation affecting Nunavut wildlife, commence implementing relevant aspects of that legislation (for instance, the *Species at Risk Act*, the *Nunavut Wildlife Act* and the *Canada National Marine Conservation Areas Act*);

- The NWMB was actively involved throughout the year in the process of listing species under the Species at Risk Act, and participated in the development of proposed recovery strategies. The Board participated in several bi-lateral talks with Canada to harmonize the SARA listing process with the NLCA decision making process.
- Along with the GN, NTI, RWOs and HTOs, the NWMB worked steadily towards the finalization of the draft Wildlife Regulations and Orders developed pursuant to the Nunavut Wildlife Act.

(w) In collaboration with the NWMB's co-management partners, work towards finalizing a consensus view on an appropriate *Live-Capture Policy* for Nunavut;

- The NWMB Chairperson met with WPAC in an effort to move forward the process of collaboratively establishing a Live-Capture Policy for Nunavut.

(x) Continue to play an appropriate role in Nunavut's fisheries development – participating in many forums, including meetings with the Government of Nunavut and NTI,, Baffin Fisheries Coalition meetings (as requested), the Federal-Provincial Atlantic Fisheries Council Working Group and the Northern Shrimp Advisory Committee, as well as maintaining frequent communications and regularly attending meetings with DFO officials; and

- The NWMB attended regular Fisheries Co-Management Partners Working Group meetings;
- NWMB staff attended the Northern Shrimp Advisory Committee (NSAC) meeting.

- In collaboration with its co-management partners and Nunavut's fishing industry, the NWMB continued to develop its proposed new Allocation Policy for Commercial Marine Fisheries.

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


Notes to the Financial Statements

For The Year Ended March 31, 2007

1. Nature of the organization

The Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) is an institution of public government established pursuant to *An Agreement Between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada*, also known as the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement*. The NWMB is the main instrument of wildlife management and the main regulator of access to wildlife in the Nunavut Settlement Area (NSA). In addition, the NWMB identifies research requirements, funds research and carries out research in order to help maintain an effective system of wildlife management in the NSA. The Board also exercises an extensive advisory authority in the marine environment adjacent to the NSA.

The Board is exempt from income taxes under Sec. 149(1)(l) of the *Income Tax Act*.

2. Significant accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared by management in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. The precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent on future events. As a result, the preparation of financial statements for the year involves the use of estimates and approximations that have been made using careful judgement. Actual results could differ from those estimates and approximations. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below:

(a) Revenue Recognition

The deferral method of revenue recognition is followed. Revenue is recognized in the year in which the related expenses are incurred.

(b) Financial Instruments

The Board's financial instruments consist of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. It is management's opinion that the company is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments. Unless otherwise noted, the fair value of these instruments approximates their carrying values.

(c) Equipment

Equipment is recorded at cost. Amortization is provided annually at rates calculated to amortize the assets over their estimated useful lives as follows:

6. Operating Contribution Carry Forward

During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2005, the Government of Canada budgeted funding was reduced by \$758,219. During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2006, this funding was reduced by an additional \$1,319,189. These amounts totaling \$2,077,408 have been approved for carry forward to be used for approved programs any time up to June, 2013.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For The Year Ended March 31, 2007

1. Purpose And Nature Of The Organization

In 1994, pursuant to *A Contract Relating to the Implementation of the Nunavut Final Agreement*, the Government of Canada provided the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) with a single payment of eleven million dollars for the establishment of a Wildlife Research Fund. Its intended purpose was to provide funding for territorial and federal government departments to carry out wildlife research approved by the NWMB.

Upon that basis, the NWMB established the Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust, which was designated a Registered Charity in 1996. Its Trustees are the members of the NWMB. Since 1997, the Trust has provided an annual funding allocation, exclusively available to government departments. That allocation is administered by the NWMB, in order to address wildlife research priorities as identified by the NWMB.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles. The precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent on future events. As a result, the preparation of financial statements for the year involves the use of estimates and approximations that have been made using careful judgement. Actual results could differ from those estimates and approximations. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the accounting policies summarized below:

(a) Fund Accounting

The Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions.

(b) Financial Instruments

The Trust's financial instruments consist of cash, marketable securities, accounts receivable, accounts payable and accrued liabilities. It is management's opinion that the trust is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments.

3. Marketable Securities

Marketable securities are valued at the lower of cost and market value. The investment in marketable securities is used to fund research. The market value of these securities at March 31, 2007 is \$19,440,739 (2006 \$18,495,208).

4. Related Party Transaction

The Nunavut Wildlife Research Trust (NWRT) receives services at no charge from the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board, a related organization whose board members are also the Trustees of the NWRT. The amount of these services has not been quantified.

5. Income Tax Status

The Trust is exempt from income taxes under Sec. 149(1)(f) of the Income Tax Act.



1. Timiutjutat Qanuirinniallu Timiup

Tapkua kinauyait qauyiharitinut atuqtauyarialiit Nunavutlu Kanataplul Kavamagimik angiktauhimayunut NWMBkunut.

Tiamaniananganut, NWMBkut timingutitilaupput Nunavut Umayunik Qauyihagtiitnut Tuqqutuyitnik, ilitariyauyutiqaqluni Taaksiyaqatangitnut 1996mi. Katimayingit NWMBkut katimayingit. 1997mit, Tuqqutuyikut aaqihuvakput aaragutamaak Kinauyani Kavamakunik kihiani piyauyunaqtunik. Aviktuqtauninga aulatauvuk NWMBkunik, umayut qauyihagtuayunaqulugit tuaviriyauyunik NWMBkunik.

2. Ilihimayut Ihviriuriniirmut Atuagat
