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

Re: Decision and recommendation regarding a request for 1000 tonnes of shrimp from Shrimp Fishing Area SF2 not allocated for the 2010 fishing season

Dear Minister Shea:

On January 28, 2010 the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board) received an application from the Baffin Fisheries Coalition (BFC) requesting a 1000 tonne allocation of shrimp from Shrimp Fishing Area (SFA2) that had not been allocated by the NWMB for the 2010 fishing season<sup>1</sup>. BFC is requesting this allocation to conduct a shrimp test fishery in 2010 using a foreign vessel to check the viability of such a fishery. A letter was written to the fishing industry members requesting any concerns on such a test fishery. The three companies, Qikiqtaaluk Corporation, Arctic Fisheries Alliance and Cumberland Sound Fisheries/Pangnirtung Fisheries Ltd have all provided their approval of this test fishery as long as it is only for the 2010 fishing season and will not provide a historical fishing precedent for BFC.

The NWMB in compliance with its *Allocation Policy for Commercial Marine Fisheries* (Allocation Policy), and taking into consideration the concerns identified by fishing industry members, has made its decision and recommendation concerning the request for the 1000 tonnes of shrimp from SF2. The NWMB is recommending approval of this 1000 tonne allocation to the Baffin Fisheries Coalition to conduct a shrimp test fishery using a foreign vessel, for the 2010 season only.

Madame Minister your decision in this matter and the approval of this test fishery is of the utmost importance to the continued development of the Nunavut fishery and support of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.

BFC made request to DFO to allow for the use of a foreign bottom to harvest its shrimp allocations in Nunavut's adjacent waters. On January 14, 2010 Minister Shea approved the request.

In order to attract a vessel with the capacity to harvest the needed quotas in Nunavut's adjacent waters it is essential that the vessel be able to harvest borealis in SFA 2 Commercial. There appears to have been a misunderstanding regarding our applications for shrimp allocations for the 2010 harvesting season. What we received was the montagui in the NSA and

none of the SFA 2 borealis commercial. To make it viable to attract a foreign vessel having access to the SFA 2 borealis commercial fishery is essential. The whole purpose of this approval by the Minister is to have a dedicated vessel harvesting these allocations. Because of the market conditions and greater demand for Borealis versus montagui we need this SFA 2 shrimp allocation outside of the Nunavut Settlement area to make this venture work.

Dear Sirs,

When the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) announced the fisheries allocations for the 2009 fishing season, 1000 mt of shrimp in SFA2 was not allocated.

As there were very few applications for this allocation of shrimp, the Fisheries Advisory Committee recommended that the balance of 1,000mt be allocated at a later date.

The NWMB now has an application for 1,000mt of shrimp from SFA2 from the Baffin Fisheries Coalition to support a proposal to have a foreign vessel dedicated to fishing the SFA1, 2 & 3 areas. This test fishery would establish whether there are sufficient resources available to make a viable fishery.

The NVVMB is requesting to know if your organizations have any concerns with the NVVMB allocating this 1,000mt to the Baffin Fisheries Coalition for the 2010 season.

### 1000 MT in Shrimp Fishing Area 2

Further to your letter dated March 1, 2010, we offer the following comments/questions related to the proposed Baffin Fisheries Coalition shrimp survey in the offshore waters adjacent to Nunavut specifically in the Shrimp Fishing Area (SFA) 2.

On the surface, the Baffin Fisheries Coalition's (BFC) application for shrimp quota in the SFA 2 to conduct a survey appears to be consistent with one of BFC's objective to establish and develop exploratory fishing activities in the Territory of Nunavut and its adjacent marine waters for the benefit of Nunavut, its' member organizations and the communities.

Furthermore, if the sub-allocation of this shrimp quota is consistent with Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's Access and Allocation Policy; that the proposed use of a foreign vessel is consistent with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada's usual rules and regulations; that the survey or test fishery is consistent with other similar survey tools and methods and indeed will complement other similar surveys done in the areas adjacent to Nunavut; that the BFC is responsible for the whole cost of the survey on behalf of Nunavut; that no history or priority access be granted to BFC in the future for this particular quota, Qikiqtaaluk Corporation supports Baffin Fisheries Coalition application for SFA 2 quota of 1,000mt.

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With reference to your letter of March 1<sup>st</sup>, on behalf of the Arctic Fishery Alliance, we wish to confirm that AFA has no concern with the NWMB allocating 1,000 mt to BFC for the 2010 season provided (a) this allocation is limited to the 2010 season only, (b) does not provide any precedent in any future decisions with BFC regarding this or other allocations and (c) the foreign vessel is restricted to harvesting this particular shrimp allocation only and is not permitted to harvest any Greenland halibut allocations in divisions 0A or 0B.

Dear Mr. Nakoolak:

Thank you for your letters dated March 18 and 23, 2010 conveying the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB) recommendations for sub-allocations of Nunavut fisheries quotas not already sub-allocated for 2010.

This is to confirm that I accept the recommendations of the NWMB with regard to the sub-allocations outside of the Nunavut Settlement Area (NSA) as outlined below:

- 1. The additional 1350t allocation to Nunavut for Turbot in NAFO Division 0B to be sub-allocated as follows:
  - a. 200t to be fished by the Arctic Fisheries Alliance (AFA);
  - b. 400t to be fished by the Baffin Fisheries Coalition (BFC);
  - c. 300t to be fished by Cumberland Sound Fisheries Ltd / Pangnirtung Fisheries Ltd; and
  - d. 450t to be fished by the Qikiqtaaluk Corporation (QC).
- The remaining 1000t allocation to Nunavut for northern shrimp (*Pandalus borealis*) in exploratory Shrimp Fishing Area 2 (E of 63° W) to be sub-allocated as follows:
  - a. 1000t to be fished by BFC for harvest by its foreign vessel charter

I would like to clarify that the shrimp fishery in Shrimp Fishing Area 2 (E of 63° W) is an exploratory fishery that was established in 1999, with a separate exploratory TAC.

I will have my officials in the Iqaluit office prepare a notice to all applicants concerning the additional 2010 commercial marine fisheries allocations.
