Dear Mr. Nakoolak:

The Scientific Council of the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organization (NAFO) has provided Total Allowable Catch (TAC) recommendations for the 2011 season for the Northern Shrimp (*Pandalus borealis*) fishery in NAFO Subareas 0 and 1, which includes Shrimp Fishing Area (SFA) 1. The Scientific Council advises that the 2011 TAC should not exceed 120,000t. This is an increase over the 2010 TAC level of 110,000t. However, the recommended TAC level is below the 2004-2008 level of 130,000t upon which existing quotas are based. Despite the increased TAC recommendation for 2011, Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) still has concerns over the status of the shrimp biomass in NAFO Subareas 0 and 1.



This letter is to advise you that in taking into account all relevant considerations, DFO is of the view that it would be more prudent, from a conservation perspective, to keep the TAC for Northern Shrimp in SFA 1 at status quo (15,583t) for 2011. Therefore, domestic offshore allocations and Nunavut and Makivik individual allocations, will remain unchanged with the caveat that if the 15,583t TAC level is reached, the fishery in SFA 1 will be closed.

The NWMB's recommendation on Individual Allocations for this fishery (included in your letter dated September 24, 2010) for the 2011 season was based on 2010 TAC levels. This recommendation was accepted by the Minister in November 2010, with the understanding that if final TACs are different from the 2010 TAC levels, individual allocations will need to be adjusted accordingly. Therefore, I would like to assure you that Nunavut Individual Allocations suggested in your letter will remain as proposed for 2011.

With regards to future requests for NWMB advice on NAFO recommended TAC levels, the NWMB will require that DFO:

- Provide a reasonable period of time for NWMB staff review and a necessary Board decision with regards to advice pertaining to recommendations of the Scientific Council;
- Where DFO has indicated conservation concerns with a particular commercial stock, provide justification and supporting evidence for these concerns so that the Board is fully informed when requested to make a decision;
- Provide indication of DFO consultations with the Nunavut fishing industry on recommendations that are important to commercial fisheries in Nunavut's adjacent waters.

The NWMB looks forward to continuing to work with Fisheries and Oceans Canada to ensure that Nunavut's marine resources are developed and managed in a sustainable and fair manner for the equitable benefit of all Nunavummiut.
