Re: Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decisions concerning Devon Island muskox harvest management

Dear Minister Savikataaq,

During its In-camera meeting (IC 005-2016) on September 14th 2016, the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB or Board) considered the Government of Nunavut – Department of Environment's *Proposal for NWMB Decision* regarding modification of total allowable harvest for Devon Island muskox (Muskox Management Unit MX-04). On September 30th 2016, the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board) provided public notice of its written public hearing to consider the harvest management of Devon Island muskox. Hearing parties included the Government of Nunavut – Department of Environment, Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated, the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board, Resolute Bay Hunters and Trappers Association, Iviq Hunters and Trappers Association (Grise Fiord), Ikajutit Hunters and Trappers Association (Arctic Bay), and Mittimatalik Hunters and Trappers Organization. The NWMB received written submissions from the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board and Mittimatalik Hunters and Trappers Organization.

The NWMB carefully considered the written arguments and evidence submitted during the public hearing¹ at its In-Camera meeting (IC 006-2016) on December 1st 2016, and approved the following resolution:

RESOLVED that the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board), pursuant to Sections 5.6.16 and Subsection 5.6.17(b) of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement, as well as the NWMB's inherent authority as the main instrument of wildlife management in the Nunavut Settlement Area:

1. *Approve an increase of the regional total allowable harvest for Devon Island muskox (Muskox Management Unit MX-04) from 15 to 100 muskox; and*
2. *Recommend that the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board consider allocating a portion of the total allowable harvest for Devon Island muskox to the community of Pond Inlet, pursuant to Subsection 5.7.6(b) of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.*

In making the above decisions, the NWMB noted the following:

- The most recent survey results of Devon Island muskox indicate the population has increased significantly over the past eight years.
- Maintaining a total allowable harvest would be a reliable means of monitoring harvest levels.
- The Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board and Iviq Hunters and Trappers Association (Grise Fiord) support the increase to a total allowable harvest of 100, based on written submissions and the Government of Nunavut – Department of Environment's consultation summary.
- Neither of the written submissions received by the NWMB expressed opposition to the proposed increase and the consultation summary did not indicate that any of the affected communities were opposed to an increase in total allowable harvest.

The NWMB is also recommending that the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board include Pond Inlet in its allocation of Devon Island muskox total allowable harvest, based on the arguments submitted by Mittimatalik Hunters and Trappers Organization and the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board.

As per Section 5.3.8 of the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement*, the NWMB is hereby forwarding its decisions concerning the harvest management of Devon Island Muskox to you for your review and consideration. The NWMB recognizes the importance of this decision and looks forward to your prompt reply and the timely completion of the *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement* Article 5 decision-making process.

Re: Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decision concerning Devon Island Muskoxen Management Unit (MX-04) Total Allowable Harvest

Thank you for your letter of December 14, 2016 outlining the decision of the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB) concerning Devon Island Muskoxen Management Unit (MX-04).

To reiterate, the decision of the NWMB is to:

Approve an increase of the regional total allowable harvest for Devon Island muskox (Muskox Management Unit MX-04) from 15 to 100.

In addition the NWMB made a recommendation that:

... the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board consider allocating a portion of the total allowable harvest for Devon Island muskox to the community of Pond Inlet, pursuant to Subsection 5.7.6(b) of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.

I am in agreement with your decision to establish a TAH of 100 for Muskoxen Management Unit MX-04 (Devon Island). As 30 days have elapsed since the decision was made it is deemed to have been accepted, and the Department will be instructed to implement the change promptly. In addition, the Department will inform the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board of your recommendation regarding the distribution of the TAH, and await their decision.



As always, I wish to thank the Board for their careful consideration of this important wildlife management issue.
