

Delta Levee Conservation Status

Threatened Species:

- The Red-necked Phalarope population in the Western Arctic has declined by 67% between 1990 and 2014. This decline is attributed to habitat loss and degradation due to climate change, specifically the melting of sea ice and land-based wetlands.
- The Red-necked Phalarope is listed as Threatened under the Species at Risk Act (SARA). Its range includes the Northwest Territories, Nunavut, and the Yukon. The species is particularly vulnerable to changes in its breeding grounds and feeding areas, which are closely linked to the availability of small fish like Arctic char.
- The Red-necked Phalarope is also listed as Threatened under SARA in the United States. Its range there includes Alaska and parts of the Yukon and Northwest Territories.
- The Red-necked Phalarope is a migratory bird that breeds in the Arctic and winters in the Pacific Ocean, primarily along the coastlines of North America and Asia.
