Re: Time for filing written submissions concerning the written public hearing on caribou sport hunts, and in future Nunavut Wildlife Management Board proceedings

Thank you for the Boardøs December 22, 2017 written notice of public hearing to consider the Government of Nunavut-Department of Environmentøs *Proposal for NWMB Decision on the limitation of sport hunting on the Qamanirjuag, Beverly, Ahiak, Lorillard, and Wager Bay caribou herds.*

The Boardøs notice gives interested parties until February 2, 2018, to file written submissions in response to the proposal.

The offices of Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI) were closed for the Christmas holiday when the Boardøs notice was given. Our staff resumed work on Tuesday, January 2.

NTIøs wildlife staff and advisers plan to review the proposal in question and the consultation summary and other relevant documents filed, consider the issues raised, and discuss those matters with affected Hunters and Trappers Organizations (HTOs) before deciding whether NTI will file a written submission. NTI assumes that a written submission is appropriate and that its representatives therefore also will need time to prepare the document. For these reasons, please extend the deadline for filing written submissions until March 2, 2018.

NTI recognizes that in the past, the Board often has limited the time for filing of initial written submissions in its proceedings to thirty days. Because the NTI needs described above are typical, and because Regional Wildlife Organizations (RWOs) and HTOs tend to be pressed to review

the relevant documents and prepare and file written comments within thirty days, NTI also requests that the Board revise its typical time for filing initial written submissions from thirty to sixty days.

Thank you for considering these requests. NTI looks forward to the Boardøs reply at its earliest convenience.
