Dear Minister Savikataaq:

RE: Request for an NWMB decision on the proposed final Management Plan for the Barren-ground Caribou (*Rangifer tarandus groenlandicus*), Dolphin and Union population, in Canada.

1. NWMB DECISION

At the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB or Board) Regular September Meeting (RM003-2017), Environment and Climate Change Canada and the Government of Nunavut-Department of Environment gave an oral presentation and presented briefing notes requesting an NWMB decision on the approval of the proposed final Management Plan for Dolphin and Union caribou (Management Plan) under the federal *Species at Risk Act*. This request was considered by the NWMB at its In-Camera Meeting (IC003-2017) on September 12th 2017, where the Board made the following decision:

RESOLVED that, pursuant to Section 5.2.34(d)(i) of the Nunavut Agreement, NWMB approve Management Plan for the Barren-ground Caribou (*Rangifer tarandus groenlandicus*), Dolphin and Union population, in Canada.

2. RATIONALE FOR THE NWMB DECISION

In addition to carefully reviewing the best available science and Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, the Board also took into consideration the following:

The Management Plan is a joint initiative between Environment and Climate Change Canada, the Government of Nunavut and the Government of Northwest Territories.

Affected communities and their supporting organizations were active participants in the development of the plan from the beginning and were consulted extensively throughout the process.

The Management Plan does not include recommendations for total allowable harvest or critical habitat for this species within the Nunavut Settlement Area.

Approval of the plan will facilitate immediate conservation actions for the Dolphin and Union caribou herd which is currently listed under the federal Species at Risk Act.

3. CONCLUSION

As per Section 5.3.17 of the *Nunavut Agreement*, the NWMB is hereby forwarding its decision on the approval of the proposed final Management Plan for Dolphin and Union caribou in Canada to you for your consideration.
