



Employment Opportunity: Community Liaison Officer

The Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) is accepting applications for a casual part-time Liaison Officer in your community. The Community Liaison Officer will join the project team for the Community-Based Monitoring Network (CBMN).

The CBMN relies on the skills and knowledge of local harvesters, who will use a customized mobile app to record travel routes, wildlife sightings, harvest information, and oral traditional knowledge while they are out on the land. Their information will build on the data collected by participating harvesters from 2025 until 2030. The database is owned and controlled by Nunavummiut and is intended to assist in local and regional wildlife management.

The Community Liaison Officer will recruit, train, and otherwise work with local harvesters on data collection, and will be responsible for managing community data in a secure and confidential manner. The Community Liaison Officer will be responsible for communications between the NWMB, participating harvesters, the Hunters and Trappers Organization, and other members of the project team. They will receive training in data collection and management and will be supported by NWMB staff and contracted parties.

Although successful candidates will receive necessary training, applicants should meet the following requirements:

- be resident in the community
- be fluent in English (written and spoken Inuktitut will be considered an asset)
- be involved in wildlife, harvesting, land skills, and/or co-management initiatives
- have basic smart phone, internet and computer skills.

Experience working with handheld computers or technical devices will be considered an asset.
