Re: Nunavut Wildlife Management Board decisions concerning proposed modifications to total allowable harvests for Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound narwhal

1. NWMB Decisions

In response to a *Proposal for Decision* (Proposal) submitted by Fisheries and Oceans Canada to the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board) at its June 2016 quarterly meeting, the NWMB held a written public hearing to consider proposed modifications to the total allowable harvests for the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound stocks.

At its In-Camera Meeting (IC001-2017) on March 8th 2017, the NWMB carefully considered the Proposal and written hearing submissions, and made the following decisions:

RESOLVED that, pursuant to Section 5.6.16 and Subsection 5.6.17(a) of the Nunavut Agreement, the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board – based on its conclusion that the former Jones Sound, Smith Sound and Parry Channel narwhal stock/population forms two separate narwhal stocks, the Jones Sound stock and Smith Sound stock – establish:

- (a) A community total allowable harvest of 76 narwhal for the Jones Sound narwhal stock; and
- (b) A community total allowable harvest of 77 narwhal for the Smith Sound narwhal stock.

RESOLVED that, pursuant to Section 5.6.16 and Subsection 5.6.17(b) of the Nunavut Agreement, the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board modify:

- (a) *The regional total allowable harvest for the Somerset Island narwhal stock from 532 narwhal to 658 narwhal; and*
- (b) *The regional total allowable harvest for the East Baffin Island narwhal stock from 122 narwhal to 206 narwhal.*

2. Reasons for the NWMB Decision


The NWMB's decisions are based on the most reliable and persuasive evidence and arguments received during the written public hearing process. All of the written submissions filed with and considered by the Board are publicly available for download from the NWMB's website (www.nwmb.com). In carrying out its deliberations, the NWMB carefully considered written submissions provided by the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board and the Nangmautaq (Clyde River) Hunters and Trappers Organization.

Both the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board and the Nangmautaq Hunters and Trappers Organization expressed support for the proposed increases to the total allowable harvests for the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound narwhal stocks. The Board noted that the Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board's submission was developed in consultation with affected communities. The NWMB also noted that the most recent scientific information provided by Fisheries and Oceans Canada supports both the increases to the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound total allowable harvests as well as the management of Jones Sound and Smith Sound narwhal as two separate stocks.

3. Conclusion

Mr. Minister, as per Section 5.3.17 of the *Nunavut Agreement*, the NWMB is hereby forwarding its decisions concerning the total allowable harvest levels for Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound narwhal to you for your review and consideration. Re: Fisheries and Oceans Canada's request to extend the Minister's response deadline (May 23rd, 2017) by 30 days regarding the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decisions on the proposed changes to the total allowable harvest levels for four high Arctic narwhal stocks (Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound, and Smith Sound).

On May 10th, 2017, the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB or Board) held a decision-making meeting via teleconference (INT-004-2017) to consider a May 4th, 2017 request from Fisheries and Oceans Canada to extend the Minister's response deadline (May 23rd, 2017) by 30 days regarding the NWMB's decisions on the proposed changes to the total allowable harvests for the Somerset island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound, and Smith Sound narwhal stocks. After reviewing the reason provided by your department for the request, the NWMB made the following decision:

RESOLVED that – as a result of a May 4th, 2017 written request from the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada – the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board will extend the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans Canada's deadline for response by 30 days to June 22nd, 2017 regarding the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's decisions on the proposed changes to the total allowable harvests for the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound, and Smith Sound narwhal stocks.

The March 8th, 2017 NWMB decision that was conveyed to the Minister on March 24th, 2017 was approval of Proposal for Decision submitted by Fisheries and Oceans Canada for the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound, and Smith Sound narwhal stocks.

In response to your reason for the requested extension, in 2012, the NWMB approved the *Integrated Fisheries management Plan (IFMP) for Narwhal in the Nunavut Settlement Area*, and therefore supports the allocation model described by that plan. NWMB expects

that when the *Nunavut Agreement* Article 5 decision making process on the changes to the total allowable harvests for high Arctic narwhal stocks is complete, this model will be used by Fisheries and Oceans Canada, with the Regional Wildlife Boards and relevant Hunter and Trappers Organizations, to determine the new allocation of summer and migratory narwhal quotas for each community that harvests a migratory stock with a regional total allowable harvest.

The NWMB's established practice is to approve reasonable Ministerial decision extension requests. This request is reasonable and should not prejudice any of the parties.

Thank you for your letters dated March 24, 2017, and May 12, 2017, concerning the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's (NWMB) decision regarding total allowable harvests for the Somerset Island, East Baffin Island, Jones Sound and Smith Sound narwhal stocks.

Pursuant to Section 5.3.18 of the *Nunavut Agreement*, I accept the NWMB's decisions to "establish a community total allowable harvest of 76 narwhal for the Jones Sound narwhal stock, and to establish a community total allowable harvest of 77 narwhal for the Smith Sound narwhal stock."

Furthermore, I accept the NWMB's decisions "to modify the regional total allowable harvest for the Somerset Island narwhal stock from 532 narwhal to 658 narwhal, and to modify the regional total allowable harvest for the East Baffin Island narwhal stock from 122 narwhal to 206 narwhal."

I appreciate your recent clarification of the Board's decision to modify levels of regional total allowable harvests for the two Baffin Bay narwhal stocks, and the Board's commitment to continue to employ the allocation model described within the NWMB-approved Integrated Fisheries Management Plan for Narwhal in the Nunavut Settlement Area.

My staff remains committed to our successful collaboration on narwhal co-management.
