Total Allowable Harvest for Bluenose-East Caribou

The Government of Nunavut recently put a Total Allowable Harvest in place for the Bluenose-East caribou herd. These caribou are an important resource for Kugluktuk hunters, as well as hunters in the Northwest Territories. Nunavummiut harvesters must now get a tag from the local wildlife office before going hunting. There are 340 tags available this year.
