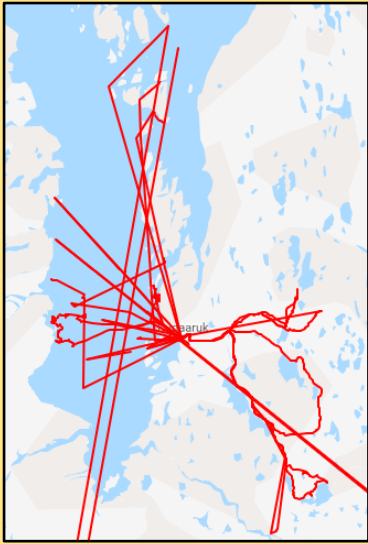


THE NUNAVUT WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT BOARD'S COMMUNITY-BASED MONITORING NETWORK

Out of Kugaaruk:

In September, Kugaarumiut were traveling by boat and ATV. There were harvest records of char, narwhal, and bearded seals. All of the animals caught were reported to be healthy.



Harvesters also documented quite a few polar bear observations last month, along with sightings of Canada geese and caribou.

Out of Clyde River:

Data collection in came to an end after three years of participation in the project. Harvesters collected over 35,000 km of travel data.

Participants met on September 26 to review their data and share their experiences with the Community-based Monitoring Network for the

In Baker Lake, harvesters were traveling by ATV in September. Caribou was the main species being caught.

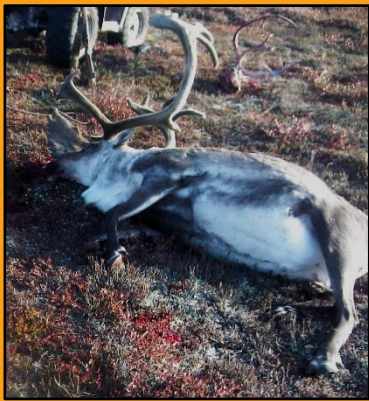


PHOTO OF THE MONTH
