## Issue: Update on the development of the Dolphin & Union Barren-ground caribou Management Plan





Barren-ground Caribou (Dolphin and Union population) was listed under the federal Species at Risk Act (SARA) in 2011. Under SARA, when a species is listed as Special Concern, a management plan must be developed within three years of listing. The management plan for Dolphin and Union caribou is due to be posted as proposed on the federal Species at Risk Registry by March 2017.

Environment Canada is working collaboratively with the co-management partners to develop the proposed management plan. The following is a list of organizations and communities that will be engaged in the development of and consultation on the management plan:

The following is the process and proposed timeline for development of the management plan:

- Completion of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Threat Calculator via teleconference with COSEWIC and in collaboration with all co-management partners (HTAs, WMBs, Parks, GNWT, GN) -December 2014. The following Nunavut representatives attended:
  - Kugluktuk HTO David Nivingalok
  - o Kugluktuk HTO Kevin Klengenberg
  - o KRWB Ema Qaggutaq
  - o GN Lisa-Marie LeClerc
- Introductory meeting/teleconference with the co-management partners from Nunavut and the Northwest Territories (HTO chairs, KWRB, NWMB, WMAC (NWT), NTI, GN, GNWT, Parks Canada) by teleconference in conjunction with the Peary caribou recovery strategy meeting in Yellowknife to discuss community input into the key elements of the management plan and process – February 2015
- Meet with HTO board members and invited guests chosen by HTOs for their familiarity with Dolphin & Union caribou to collect additional information and Inuit knowledge for the draft management plan Spring 2015
- Completion of draft management plan Fall 2015
  - o Review of draft management plan by co-management partners Winter 2015/2016
  - Consultation on draft management plan Winter 2015/2016

• Formally request NWMB approval and Wildlife Management Advisory Council (WMAC- NWT) support on the draft management plan – March 2016.
