



**Qikiqtaaluk Wildlife Board
Executive Meeting
February 3, 2022**

WHEREAS in November 2020, the QWB AGM passed a resolution (Appendix A) to prohibit live-handling and related research of wild mammals in Qikiqtaaluk Region based on published peer-reviewed scientific papers showing risks of transmission of the COVID-19 virus from humans to mammals;

WHEREAS the QWB committed to review this prohibition annually, which the QWB Executive has undertaken;

WHEREAS on April 7, 2021, the Government of Nunavut refused to postpone their research programs of live-handling of caribou, in part because at that time:

- the available peer-reviewed scientific evidence for many species of mammals was based on modelling of their potential susceptibility to the virus and not actual infections;
- evidence of COVID infections of non-human mammals came from captive wildlife not closely related to caribou or polar bears, and
- there had been zero (0) cases of SARS-COV-2 in the Baffin region of Nunavut.

WHEREAS all of the above points have now changed, with:

- wild white-tailed deer, a species closely related to caribou, in Quebec and 4 states in the USA testing positive for the COVID virus, proving the susceptibility modeling to be valid and not restricted to captive mammals;
- the number of human COVID cases in Qikiqtaaluk Region has hit many communities in Qikiqtaaluk Region; and
- human infections are not prevented by vaccination against the recent variant of COVID, and individual persons can change from being negative to being positive within 24 hours;

WHEREAS healthy wildlife populations are extremely important to the nutrition and culture of future generations of Inuit, and the potential impacts of COVID on wildlife populations are currently unknown;

WHEREAS Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit and other non-invasive research methods will continue to be available to manage wildlife without any need for live-handling by humans;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that

1. The QWB requests the federal and territorial Ministers responsible for wildlife and scientific research and protected area permitting and licensing in Qikiqtaaluk Region to prohibit the live-handling of all wild mammals in Nunavut at least until March 31, 2023.

2. This prohibition will continue to be reviewed by the QWB Executive annually, and renewed annually until the potential risks of human-wildlife transmission and wildlife health risks from the COVID virus are considered negligible.
3. The QWB further requests that the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board makes a decision supports these prohibitions and restrictions in Qikiqtaaluk Region.
