Dear Mr. Noble:

RE: Status Report and Further Response to the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board's May 8th, 2014 request for new materials concerning the Southampton Island Caribou Public Hearing

Further to the Government of Nunavut's Supplementary submissions to the Nunavut Wildlife Management Board (NWMB) on March 31st, 2014, our response to NWMB's request for new materials on May 21st, 2014, and correspondence on May 23rd, 26th, and June 10th, 2014, this is to provide the NWMB with a status update with respect to the GN's efforts to locate and obtain relevant information concerning:

- i) those licenses issued by the Government of Nunavut to the company(ies) responsible for commercial harvesting of Southampton Island caribou; and
- ii) commercial sales of those caribou harvests inside and outside the Nunavut Settlement Area.

For the Board's convenience, we have listed each of the items requested in your May 8, 2014 letter below and where possible, provided additional information:

A. The NWMB Information Request:

1. True complete copies of licenses issued to the company responsible for "commercial" harvesting of Southampton Island (SHI) caribou, referred to by the GN, from and including 1996 to 2007, including all license conditions.

The GN has made best efforts to search files in the Regional Manager's Office, the Regional Files and in Coral Harbour Office. No files respecting commercial licenses



were discovered in any of these locations. As we previously submitted, these files or records pre-date the GN's existence. They are also older than the seven years prescribed under the *Archives Act*, which likely means that they would have been destroyed pursuant to GN document management procedures.

However, we have been able to locate three copies of commercial Wildlife Licences issued for Coral Harbour in 2006, 2007 and 2009. Attached, please find:

Appendix A: Commercial Wildlife Licence CW000354 to Coral Harbour Community Development Corporation issued on February 1st, 2006.

Appendix B: Commercial Wildlife Licence CW000356 to Aiviit Hunters and Trappers Organization issued in February 2nd, 2007.

Appendix C: Copy of the Commercial Wildlife Licence CW 000361 to Sudliq Developments Limited issued on February 20th, 2009.

Appendix D: Accompanied the Licence CW 000361 are the legal requirements entitled "Licence Conditions for Commercial Wildlife Licence CW 000361, issued to Sudliq Developments Corporation (As represented by Dino Bruce, Director of Operations) of Coral Harbour, Nunavut for the harvest of Caribou in 2009."

Appendix E: A copy of the Coral Harbour 2009 Commercial Caribou Harvest Plan submitted by Sudliq Developments Ltd to the Regional Superintendent of the Kivalliq Region, Department of Environment, Government of Nunavut.

Appendix F: An excerpt of the relevant sections of the applicable Wildlife Business Regulations, R-024-92.

Similar to the conditions accompanying the Commercial Wildlife Licence issued to Sudliq Developments Limited in 2009, the licences in 2006 and 2007 would have been issued under similar conditions.

We are informed that, the GN would have received a Harvest Plan proposal for each of the commercial wildlife licences that were issued, similar to the Sudliq Development Harvest Plan and the information that it contains.



 The best documentary evidence in the GN's possession – or available to the GN – for the same period, concerning employment of the hunters, the terms of the employment, and the identity of the employer (subject to applicable privacy laws);

As previously submitted, while the GN would have licensed the commercial harvest and the processing facilities after 1999 and carried out inspections. We would not have have collected detailed information about the identity of the workers working for the company, nor about their terms and conditions of employment.

Nevertheless, we would refer the Board to the Sudliq Development's Harvest Plan at **Appendix E** which presents useful information regarding the company profile, its project team which includes information concerning the employment of hunters.

- 3. The best available evidence supporting the GN's understanding of the following facts:
 - a) That all SHI caribou harvested for the meat plant in 2007 was for sale outside the Nunavut Settlement Area; and

We have made best efforts to obtain customer sales information from the Kivalliq Arctic Foods from 2006-2007. The information is compiled in the attached **Appendix G**: **Customer Sales 2006-2007**.

We note that where there may be references to Muskox, this was likely caribou.

b) That all caribou harvested for the meat plant in the years 1996 to 2001, inclusive, was for sale outside the NSA; and

We have made best efforts to compile what customer sales information we have been able to obtain from the Kivalliq Arctic Foods for 1999-2001. The information is compiled in the attached **Appendix H: Customer Sales 1999-2001**.

- 4. If the GN disputes any of the following facts asserted by NTI, the GN's best available evidence of its different understanding:
 - a) All meat sold by the plant until approximately 1995 was sold in the Northwest Territories;

We also understand from the Kivalliq Arctic Foods that caribou meat harvested before 1998 or 1999 was sold from the initial harvest to a company in Ontario. Little was sold to *Kivalliq Arctic Foods* until 1998 or 1999.

- b) From approximately 1996 until 2007, sales from the plant were not limited to destinations outside the NSA in particular:
 - Smoked ribs, hocks and dry meat were sold in the NSA; and

ii. Cuts packaged for export continued to be sold to Nunavut restaurants, and perhaps to other Nunavut buyers (Logically inferred from pre-1995 history); and

Please refer to our response dated May 21st, 2014.

iii. Some of the skins were distributed and used locally (sleeping skins, sewing clothing etc.), and

Further to our previous answers, we have been advised by the Kivalliq Arctic Foods that the caribou skins were generally not used. We understand that from February through March, the hair of the caribou skins tend to fall out easily and as a result the only real use would be for sled skins. While there were attempts to make leather with some of the skins, the final products suffered from too many holes from fly larvae.

iv. Tongues, hearts, back fat (tuunu), leg marrow and briskets were transported back to Coral Harbour for distribution to community residents.

We understand that meat that was deemed not suitable by Federal Regulations (e.g. tongues, brisket, liver) were distributed in Coral Harbour.

B. Summary of Events & Next Steps

We note that on March 31st, 2014, the GN submitted its Supplementary Submission to the NWMB. The GN's submission set out its proposed approach on the issues relevant to the regional TAH and calculation of the regional BNL. In doing so, the GN referred to relevant statistical information and evidence attached as appendices to its



Supplementary Submission. Much of the evidence has been previously provided to the NWMB.

On May 2nd, 2014, Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. (NTI) submitted its reply to the GN's Supplementary Submission (NTI Reply).

As the Applicant in this matter, we have yet to have the opportunity to respond to NTI Reply.

On May 8, 2014, the NWMB requested that the GN file new materials to address the specific information and evidence that NTI felt should be made available by May 21st, 2014.

On May 21st, 2014, the GN responded to the NWMB's request with concerns regarding procedural fairness of NWMB's request for new materials, the GN nevertheless undertook to continue best efforts to locate and provide the NWMB with the relevant information.

With this status report and evidence appended to it, we trust that the Board is satisfied that no additional materials or evidence from the GN is necessary to proceed with the public hearing.

On May 26th, 2014, the GN again expressed it concerns with respect to how parties are to proceed. As the applicant, the GN requires time to review and respond to the new materials and arguments from all parties including NTI, if necessary. The GN is concerned about the procedure that the Board may take to test evidence, including evidence from potential witnesses. The GN is also concerned with NTI's suggestions that i) NTI should have the ability to question the GN's legal argument or position; and ii) the Board's counsel would participate in the Public Hearing by providing a presentation on the Board's position regarding the BNL calculation.

We understand that counsel will meet again in July. To this end, we expect that at the end of the next meeting, counsel will reach on consensus a proposed outline of all procedural aspects for parties to proceed with the hearing in this matter.



Licence Conditions for Commercial Wildlife Licence CW 000361, issued to Sudliq Developments Corporation (As represented by Dino Bruce, Director of Operations) of Coral Harbour, Nunavut for the harvest of Caribou in 2009.

- 1) These conditions are attached to the licence pursuant to the authority of section 30 of the Wildlife Act. The licence is subject to these terms and conditions.
- 2) In the commercial harvest, the proponent is authorized to harvest up to 850 Caribou from Southampton Island, as allocated to them by the Aiviit Hunters and Trappers Organization. All caribou that are killed are to be included in the total kill. This includes caribou that are deemed unfit for processing, local use, or both.
- 3) The proponent is authorized to harvest and process caribou in accordance with the "harvest plan" (with the exceptions noted below), the Wildlife Act and Regulations, and these conditions.
- 4) If a hunter shoots a caribou that shows signs of brucella infection including enlarged reproductive organs, multiple (two or more) enlarged joints, and is in poor body condition, and the hunter deems that the caribou is unfit for usage, then:
 - a. The hunter is required to mark/record the location of the carcass by GPS and to report the incident and location to the Director of Operations on returning to the abattoir/camp
 - b. If requested by DOE staff, the Director of Operations will be required to provide the locations and kill dates for any carcasses that were not utilized due to being suspected of being diseased.
 - c. The Director of Operations is to ensure that all such kills are included in the total kill for the project.
 - d. The Director of Operations is to arrange, on a daily basis, for such carcasses to be collected and hauled to the disposal site. It is expected that a dedicated sled and operator will be required for this component, and that all staff will take appropriate safety precautions.
 - e. DOE Staff will be on site for at least a part of the harvesting operation. While there they may request that some of the suspected diseased carcasses be brought to them for inspection, testing, and/or sampling.
- 5) The proponent is required to record the sex and pregnancy rates of all harvested caribou including condemned animals and report these figures weekly to the Conservation Officer and/or Regional Wildlife Biologist. This record need only be

a simple tally of the sex of each caribou, and whether or not each female is pregnant.

Introduction

The Aiviit Hunters and Trappers Organization (HTO) in consultation with Mitch Campbell, Regional Biologist, Department of Environment (DOE), Government of Nunavut has recommended a 2009 commercial caribou harvest quota of 1000 animals for the Coral Harbour area.

The HTO passed motion number 303/09/09 in September 2009 that states:

"That the Aiviit Hunters & Trappers Organization approves to have a caribou harvest in winter, 2009. 850 commercial tags are allocated to Nunavut Development Corporation."

The Nunavut Development Corporation has subsequently assigned the 850 commercial tags to its caribou meat processing subsidiary company Kivalliq Arctic Foods Ltd. (KAF) to undertake the harvest. KAF subsequently will carry out the harvest to standards set by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA).

In order for the meat to be exportable outside of Nunavut both the harvest and abattoir operation will be approved by CFIA per the meat inspections regulations for export of meat.

Organizational Structure/Project Team

Company Profile:

Sudliq Developments Limited was incorporated as a company in 1985. Since its existence, Sudliq has been involved with various construction projects with the Government of the Northwest Territories (prior to 1999), the Government of Nunavut and other businesses. These projects include: harbour dredging, break water construction, Kirchoffer Bridge construction, road construction, solid waste upgrades, sewage lagoon, water reservoir expansion, bio-farm construction, house pads, fuel deliveries, house mobilizations, cartage services, snow removal, office rental, pizza take out, soft drink sales and the sale of oil products. The majority of these projects required partnerships and working relationships with professional engineers, architects, suppliers, sub-contractors and community leaders. Our working relationships with these individuals has been successful over the years and we have maintained good cliental with our partnerships. We have been fortunate in completing all our projects and contracts according to the specifications of our clients since 1985.

This company previously had 2 owners. The partners who had 50-50 shares in this company were Mr. Louie Bruce and Mr. Patrick Netser. In 2000-01, Mr. Bruce bought all shares held by Mr. Netser. During this time, Sudliq Developments Ltd. was slightly restructured where a Director of Operations was hired and an accountant was hired to perform financial responsibilities of the company. Mr. Bruce has a wealth of construction and managing experience. Just to name a few, he has supervised projects

such as the Harbour Dredging, Kirchoffer Bridge Construction, Access Road Construction, and the other projects involving construction.

Mr. Bruce was involved with the Coral Harbour Development Corporation (this local corporation ran the caribou harvest from 2002 to 2005) as a board member in 2002-2004. He then became the chair person for CDC in 2005. Although, Mr. Bruce would not be directly involved with this harvest, his experience in the day to day operations of past caribou harvests with CDC would be beneficial to our project team as an advisor.

Project Team:

The **Director of Operations** for this project will be **Dino Bruce**. Dino has been working for Sudliq Developments Limited since 1992. He first worked as a fuel truck driver, aviation fuel handler and a heavy equipment operator. In 1995, Dino started working with project engineers in the field of construction as an operator and a foreman representing Sudliq Developments Ltd. Although he has not received any formal education in civil engineering, he has been supervising projects since 2001. He has supervised construction projects such as water reservoir expansion, solid waste upgrades, sewage lagoon, biofarm, sewage deflection berms, barge landing and site clean-up, cartage services, snow removal and day to day operations of fuel deliveries. Dino has not been directly involved with any activities pertaining to the commercial caribou harvest in the past. We feel he is capable of completing this type of project because of his experience in major and minor construction projects. He has been able to work closely with project managers in the field of construction and complete projects to the satisfaction of our clients whatever the task maybe.

Finance officer for this project will be Doris Bruce. She will be responsible for invoicing, payroll, book keeping, ordering camp supplies, ensuring all financial matters are within Revenue Canada standards and all insurable requirements are met according to the RFP (appendix B). Prior to working for Sudliq Developments Limited she was working for the local District Education Authority from 1997 to 2007. During this time, she received her certification in simply accounting, basic accounting and gained managerial experience. Doris was also responsible for filing income tax, unemployment insurance, payroll, yearend financial statements, audit reports, and monthly financial reports. Currently, as our comptroller and finance officer, she is responsible for payroll, income tax filing, accounts receivable, accounts payable, invoicing, fuel service weekly/monthly reports, managing staff, keeping stock of pizza products and other company related obligations. During her short tenure with the caribou harvest in 1995-97, she obtained valuable experience of the day to day operations of the harvest.

Supervisor for this project will **Mr. Noel Kaludjak**. The supervisor will be responsible for all camp operations, work closely with CFIA officials to ensure the camp is within CFIA standards, ensure all camp equipment are in good running order, work with subcontractors to ensure quality service, mobilize and demobilize the camp, daily logs of day to day operations, transportation of camp crew and other duties related to this project. Noel is a long time resident of Coral Harbour and is well respected by his peers. His

ability to work with people would be beneficial to a project like the caribou harvest. He first gained experience with the caribou harvest as a hunter and maintainer from 2001-2003 and then as a supervisor/foreman in 2004 and 2005. We are confident in his abilities to carry out the day to day operations of the camp and abettor.

Camp foreman for this project would be selected in a competitive process if we were the successful proponents. This person would be required to work closely with the supervisor and CFIA officials. His responsibilities would include the safe return of all hunters daily, keep a daily report of caribou being harvested, ensure camp workers report to work daily, all labourers have transportation to job site and ensure the inventory of camp supplies are adequate.

Hunters for this project will be handpicked from the community. We feel the responsibility of these people is too great and too dangerous to hire anyone who may not have adequate equipment (snowmobile, sleds, firearms, safety equipment) and experience. We have proposed to use 8 hunters for this project. These hunters would be responsible for the well being of their equipment and work with our supervisor. Anytime the weather would become an issue, they would work closely with our supervisor to determine the closure of the camp.

Abettor workers or labourers will consist of 15 people. We will have 2 leggers, 1 header, 3 skinners, 1 torch carrier, 1 gutter, 1 splitter, 2 trimmers, 2 packers, 1 gut hauler and 1 water deliverer. The people selected to work at the abettor would work closely with the camp foreman. They would be stationed inside and outside (gut hauler, legger) the abettor and would be required to perform their duties in a safe and acceptable manner to the satisfaction of the CFIA officials and our senior staff.

1 **fuel handler** will work strictly with petroleum products. He would have all the duties relating to fuel products. He would refuel hunters' snowmobiles, refuel buildings where necessary and work with the hunters who may require minor maintenance on their equipment.

2 **caterers** would be hired for this project. These people will be responsible for the lunches of all staff members at the camp. They would be required to prepare meals, prepare snacks, deliver and keep inventory of food products.

Canadian Food Inspection Agency members at the worksite will work closely with our supervisor and ensure all camp equipment; staff members and anything related to the harvest are within CFIA standards.

Sub-contractors and suppliers will be from the community except for the supply of plastic bags and combo bins. All snow removal, oil products, mobilization and demobilization equipment would be our own forces. Ammunition, food supplies, and other small items would be purchased at the local store.

Operational Structure

Responsibility for the harvest, which includes orchestrating the field harvesting and operation of the abattoir, will reside with the Harvest Manager. The Harvest Manager will report to the Director of Operations for Sudliq Developments Ltd. of day to day operations.

Harvesting

The harvesting of 850 caribou is scheduled to begin tentatively the week of February 23, 2009 and will be conducted over a period of three weeks, weather permitting. Harvesting will take place from Monday to Monday (7 days per week) for a total of 21 days; the abattoir will operate concurrently to accept and process the carcasses. If weather conditions are poor the harvest may be extended a few more days.

The abattoir is located 2.5 kilometres north-east of the Coral Harbour airport terminal along the road to the non-direction beacon. Latitude: 64°12'24"N Longitude: 83°19'48"W

On March 1 sunrise is estimated at 7:40 am and sunset is estimated at 5:55 pm for a total of 10 1/4 hours. For safety and hunting accuracy this means that the hunters will have ample sunlight during the harvesting period when starting. In addition the length of daylight will permit enough time to harvest a sufficient number of animals to ensure the abattoir operation is efficient.

Caribou will be harvested using traditional hunting method where hunters go out and shoot the animals. Hunters will use 22-250 or larger calibres and will be instructed to take head and neck shots as this will result in the maximum amount of meat for processing and produce the least amount of wastage. For animals shot in the body every effort will be made to utilize the meat for processing as allowed by CFIA inspectors. Meat deemed unsuitable for human consumption will be disposed.

Hunters will be instructed to harvest both males and females in a 50/50 ratio as instructed by Mitch Campbell during his conference call with the HTO / NDC / KAF on December 10, 2009. Yearlings will be avoided.

Hunters will bleed the animals at the site by cutting completely through the carotid artery behind the jawbone, and the oesophagus will be cut to prevent abdominal bloating. The carcasses will be placed on poly tarps on a sled which will be pulled by snowmobile to the abattoir.

If it becomes apparent a hunter cannot consistently make head or neck shots then this hunter will be replaced by one of the other team members who can produce the desired results.

Harvesting will take place within a radius of 30 to 35 miles of the community with consideration given for the 3 mile 'no shoot' zone around the community.

Up to eight hunters will be engaged in the harvest. Harvesting will be done in teams of two for safety reasons in case of equipment breakdown, accident or inclement weather. Only hunters who have the traditional knowledge and skills necessary to successfully navigate to a harvest site, efficiently dispatch the animals, and transport the carcasses to the abattoir will be contracted. Previous commercial harvest experience will be a prime consideration in determining who will be contracted. Hunters will provide their own equipment (snowmobile, sled, .243 or larger calibre rifle, stove, sleeping bag), supplies (naphtha, food, rope) and some form of communication (HF radio or satellite phone) in case of emergency.

The daily objective will be to harvest and transport eighty to one hundred (80 to 100) animals to the abattoir. Hunters will leave from their houses prior to sunrise so that they may be able to harvest animals at first light. A hunter will shoot and cut the jugular vein of four to eight caribou shortly after sunrise and then transport these animals to the abattoir (approximately one hour haul time) and then return to the harvest site to shoot and haul back another four to eight carcasses each. It is anticipated the hunters will make two trips each per day with the last animals arriving at the abattoir about 3 pm. This will allow for the processing of the last animals and allow time for end of the day cleanup so the daily operations can be completed by approximately 5 pm. After the cleanup and preparation for the next day's harvest is done the hunters and abattoir staff will return home for the evening.

Timing of kills will be coordinated with the abattoir manager by communicating a daily harvest plan to the hunters the day before and during the harvest day as they arrive at the camp. The intent is to have a steady flow of animals arriving at the abattoir so processing can proceed in a timely and efficient manner without having carcasses stockpiled outside the abattoir.

Abattoir

The abattoir is located adjacent to a power line and will have a 'stable' electrical service as it will be connected to the power grid. In doing so there will be no need to operate a generator as had been the case in previous harvest.

Water and sewage services will be provided by the Municipality in accordance with their policies and regulations.

Garbage Disposal

Offal and other by-products deemed not suitable for human consumption will be disposed of in a pit across the road from the abattoir. This pit was dug by the Municipality of Coral Harbour in October specifically for this purpose. Once the harvest is completed the above waste will be burned and then when ground conditions allow it, the by-products will be covered over by the granular material

Other waste such as used paper towels and soiled coveralls will be secured in garbage bags and hauled to the municipal dump.

Waste water and sewage will be pumped from sewage tanks by the municipal sewage truck and disposed of in the local sewage lagoon.

Disposition of Edible Products

All certified caribou meat will be packaged in 64 cubic foot combo bins (cardboard boxes) on wooden pallets. These combo bins will be held temporarily at the abattoir site (up to three days) before being transported to a storage site at the Coral Harbour airport for shipment to Rankin Inlet by Calm Air.. It is anticipated the meat is the combo bins will be shipped twice weekly, and more frequently if aircraft space permits.

To ensure product integrity abattoir staff will monitor the condition of the packages at least twice daily and take appropriate measures, if necessary, for example using temporary fencing to discourage animals such as foxes and ravens from damaging the product.

Pest Control

The vicinity of the abattoir will be monitored by staff, specifically personnel whose duties take them outside, and any observations of animals in the area will be reported to the Harvest Manager. The Harvest Manager will take appropriate action to reduce any immediate contact and then report the incident to the respective local authorities – Municipal By-Law Officer for loose pets and foxes, and the Wildlife Officer for foxes and other predators.

Every effort will be made to keep the area around the abattoir free of waste that may attract animals. It is expected the ongoing daily activities will be deterrent enough to keep animals away and by maintaining a clean environment there will be little to attract animals during the nocturnal hours.

Community Issues

Detailed and on-going Consultation has taken place with the Aiviit Hunters and Trappers Organization and the Coral Harbour Hamlet Council about the planned abattoir operation to determine if there are any issues or concerns they feel need to be addressed from a community and a municipal perspective. At this time there appear to be no outstanding community issues and both the HTO and the Hamlet are supportive of the harvest.

Department of Resources, Wildlife and Economic Development staff only.

Excerpts from the Wildlife Business Regulations:

COMMERCIAL WILDLIFE LICENCE

- **22.** (1) The Superintendent shall indicate on the face of each commercial wildlife license whether the holder of that license is entitled to do any of the following:
 - (a) round up wildlife;
 - (b) hold wildlife:
 - (c) feed wildlife;
 - (d) transport wildlife;
 - (e) slaughter wildlife;
 - (f) process slaughtered wildlife;
 - (g) sell the meat, hides, horns, antlers and by-products of slaughtered wildlife.
 - (2) The Superintendent may attach conditions in respect of the exercise of the entitlement granted under subsection (1), to a commercial wildlife license and these conditions may include, but are not limited to,
 - (a) methods of herding or rounding up wildlife;
 - (b) the type of facilities suitable for holding wildlife and the length of time and conditions in which wildlife may be held;
 - (c) the type of quality of feed and the frequency of feeding;
 - (d) methods of transporting wildlife;
 - (e) methods and practices for slaughtering wildlife;
 - (f) types and locations of processing facilities or abattoirs;
 - (g) processing wildlife; and
 - (h) specific dates during which the holder of the license may harvest wildlife.

- 23. (1) Before applying for a commercial wildlife license, a company shall contact each HTA operating in the area of the proposed commercial harvest and shall request that each HTA set aside a number of tags for the use of the company.
 - (2) An HTA may agree to, vary or refuse a request under subsection (1).
 - (3) Where an HTA agrees to or varies a request under subsection (1), the HTA shall reply, in writing, to the company and shall indicate the number of tags that the HTA will allocate to the company.
 - (4) Where an HTA refuses a request under subsection (1), the HTA shall reply, in writing, to the company and shall provide reasons for the refusal.
- **24.** (1) An applicant that applies for a commercial wildlife license shall provide to the Superintendent
 - (a) the number of phases of the proposed commercial harvest;
 - (b) a project outline for each phase of the commercial harvest to be held including
 - (i) the name and address of the person to be in charge of the proposed commercial harvest.
 - (ii) the location of the proposed commercial harvest,
 - (iii) the approximate dates of each phase of the proposed commercial harvest,
 - (iv) the species of wildlife to be the subject of the commercial harvest,
 - (v) the methods to be used to round up the wildlife,
 - (vi) the location and type of facility to be used to hold the wildlife,
 - (vii) the length of time the wildlife will be held before the slaughter,
 - (viii) the type of facility and process to be used to slaughter wildlife,
 - (ix) the proposed use of wildlife parts and by-products, and
 - (x) a disposal plan for the waste material;
 - (c) letters from each HTA in the area of the commercial harvest indicating the number of tags allocated to the commercial harvest; and
 - (d) any other information the Superintendent may require.
 - (2) An applicant shall submit an application at least 60 days before the start of the first phase of the commercial harvest.
 - (3) The Superintendent may require changes to be made to the project outline before the issuance of the license.
 - (4) The information provided under subsection (1) and the changes required under subsection (3) constitute the conditions of the license.

- (5) The Superintendent may allow an applicant to apply after the commencement of the 60 day period set out in subsection (2).
- 25. (1) The holder of a commercial wildlife license shall, at least 30 days before the start of each phase of the commercial harvest except the first, submit a project outline for the next phase of the commercial harvest.
 - (2) The Superintendent may require changes to be made to a project outline before the start of a phase of the commercial harvest.
 - (3) The Superintendent may allow a holder of a commercial wildlife license to submit a project outline after the commencement of the 30 day period set out in subsection (1).
 - (4) Where the Superintendent requires changes to a project outline, the holder of a commercial wildlife license shall make the changes required before the start of the first phase of the commercial harvest to which the outline refers.
- **26.** No holder of a commercial wildlife license shall round up or slaughter wildlife except under the supervision of an officer.
- **27.** The fees payable for a commercial wildlife license are as follows:
 - (a) where an application is made by a person who does not hold a license, the fee is \$500:
 - (b) where an application is made by a person who holds a license, the fee is \$250.
